INSTRUCTIONS FOR OUR ONLINE IN-HOME WORSHIP SERVICE

Thank you for joining us today in our online in-home worship service! This service is designed to be used with just one person or with your family and friends who have gathered to thank and praise Jesus for his continued goodness to us. Print as many copies of this bulletin as you wish or follow along looking at this file on any computer, tablet or phone.

Before watching, it may be helpful to remove distractions from the room such as pets, loud toys, etc. Parents might explain to children that we will be worshiping Jesus while the video is playing, listening and responding just like we usually do at church. It might feel a little odd at first to worship this way, but if you explain the situation beforehand, you can expect better participation in your home.

SEASON OF LENT 2020

Lent is a season of contrasts. On Sundays in Lent this year, we are learning about our Christian faith by focusing on the second lessons appointed for the season of Lent as we prepare for Easter. Each of these second lessons illuminate a sharp contrast. We will highlight these contrasts of Lent through preaching, teaching, and black and white art. We will see how God reveals the stark contrast between sinful humans and the redeeming God-man, between doing it yourself and trusting in God, between being darkness or being light in the Lord. Get a glimpse of the "old self" and "new self" to see



and appreciate the transformation that God has accomplished through Christ. The contrasts are as opposite as death and life. The only one who could accomplish these transformations is the one who humbled himself, so that we could be changed, and exalted.

Minister: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.


Congregation: Amen.

C: My salvation depends on God. He is my fortress, my mighty Rock.


M: Trust in him at all times, O people; pour out your hearts to him. for God is our Refuge.

CONFESSION OF SINS

- M: As we approach God in worship, we must come humbly, recognizing our sinfulness and acknowledging our unworthiness. Let us confess our sin to God and then let us rejoice together in God's Word of forgiveness.
- C: Lord God, I am a poor and damnable sinner, for I have broken your commandments repeatedly with sinful thoughts, sinful words, and sinful actions. I deserve your anger and eternal punishment. But I am sincerely sorry for my sin. And I plead for your mercy for the sake of Jesus Christ, my Savior.

ABSOLUTION

M: If the Lord kept a record of our sins, who could stand? But with him there is forgiveness. That's why God is feared. God is faithful and just and, if we confess our sins, he will forgive us and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. In Christ, God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting our sins against us. So, take heart, your sins are forgiven. Go now and forsake your life of sin. Serve your God in peace.

C: Amen.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

M: The Lord be with you.

C: And also with you.

M: Let us pray.

Abba, dear Father, pour out your Spirit on our hearts and lives that we may trust in Jesus alone for the forgiveness of our sins. And, when we must share in the sufferings of our Savior, strengthen us to bear our crosses with patience and faith, so that one day we may also share in the glory of heaven, the marvelous inheritance that you have prepared for all your sons and daughters, through Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit

C: One God, forever and ever. Amen.

THE WORD

FIRST LESSON 2 Kings 4:18-37

The story is heartbreaking: a barren woman gives birth to a promised child. All her hopes and love wrapped themselves up in this little boy, until the day his head hurt. He died in his mother's lap while she rocked him. Can you imagine the tears? Death is the bitter lot we inherited from Adam. But God wants us to know that even in the face of a death as heartrending as this, he promises that whoever believes in him will live, even though he dies. So, he lets Elisha pay an advance on the inheritance waiting for the coheirs of Christ, that we might know and believe that Jesus one day will raise us from death to life.

¹⁸The boy grew up, and one day he went out to his father, who was with the reapers. ¹⁹Then he said to his father, "My head! My head!"

His father said to his servant, "Carry him to his mother." ²⁰ So he picked him up and carried him to his mother, and the boy sat on her lap until noon. Then he died.

²¹Then she went up and laid him on the bed of the man of God. She shut the door behind her and went out. ²²Then she called to her husband and said, "Send one of the servants to me with one of the donkeys, so that I can run to the man of God and come back."

²³He said, "Why are you going to him today? It's not the new moon, and it's not the Sabbath."

But she said, "It's all right."

²⁴Then she saddled the donkey and said to her servant, "Lead the way. Don't slow down for me unless I tell you."

²⁵ So she went to the man of God at Mount Carmel.

When the man of God saw her from a distance, he said to his servant Gehazi, "Look! That's the woman from Shunem! ²⁶ Now run to meet her and say, 'Are you all right? Is your husband all right? Is your son all right?"

She answered, "We're all right."

²⁷Then she came to the man of God at the mountain, and she grasped his feet. Gehazi stepped forward to push her away, but the man of God said, "Leave her alone, for her soul is in distress, but the LORD has hidden it from me. He has not told me."

²⁸Then she said, "Did I ask my lord for a son? Didn't I say, 'Don't give me false hope'?"

²⁹Then Elisha said to Gehazi, "Hike up your garments for travel, and take my staff in your hand and go! If you meet someone, do not greet him, and if someone greets you, do not answer. Put my staff on the boy's face."

³⁰ But the boy's mother said, "As surely as the LORD lives and your soul lives, I will not leave you." So he got up and followed her. ³¹ Gehazi went ahead of them and put the staff on the boy's face. But there was no sound, and there was no response. So he went back to Elisha and told him, "The boy did not wake up."

³²When Elisha came to the house, there the boy was—dead, lying on his bed. ³³So he went in and he shut the door behind the two of them. Then he prayed to the LORD. ³⁴He got up and lay down on top of the boy. He put his mouth to the boy's mouth, his eyes to the boy's eyes, his palms to the boy's palms. Then he bent down over him, and the boy's flesh became warm. ³⁵He went back into the house and paced back and forth. Then he went up and bent down over him, and the boy sneezed seven times. Then the boy opened his eyes.

³⁶Then Elisha called Gehazi and said, "Call the woman of Shunem!" So he called her, and she came in. He said, "Pick up your son." ³⁷So she came in and fell at Elisha's feet and bowed down to the ground. Then she picked up her son and went out.

GOSPEL John 11:17-27, 38-45

Jesus performed the greatest miracle of his ministry to prove to us the certainty of his greatest promise. He has defeated death and we will all rise from death to live eternally with him in heaven.

¹⁷When Jesus arrived, he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days.

¹⁸ Bethany was near Jerusalem, about two miles away. ¹⁹ Many Jews had come to Martha and Mary to comfort them concerning their brother.

²⁰When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went to meet him, while Mary was sitting in the house.

²¹ Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. ²² But even now I know that whatever you ask from God, God will give you."

²³ Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise again."

²⁴Martha replied, "I know that he will rise in the resurrection on the Last Day."

²⁵ Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me will live, even if he dies. ²⁶ And whoever lives and believes in me will never perish. Do you believe this?"

²⁷ "Yes, Lord," she told him. "I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, who was to come into the world."

³⁸ Jesus was deeply moved again as he came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone was lying against it. ³⁹ "Take away the stone," he said.

Martha, the dead man's sister, told him, "Lord, by this time there will be an odor, because it has been four days."

⁴⁰ Jesus said to her, "Did I not tell you that if you believe, you will see the glory of God?" ⁴¹ So they took away the stone.

Jesus looked up and said, "Father, I thank you that you heard me. ⁴² I knew that you always hear me, but I said this for the benefit of the crowd standing here, so that they may believe that you sent me." ⁴³ After he said this, he shouted with a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!"

⁴⁴ The man who had died came out with his feet and his hands bound with strips of linen and his face wrapped with a cloth. Jesus told them, "Loose him and let him go."

⁴⁵ Therefore many of the Jews who came to Mary and saw what Jesus did believed in him.

SERMON Romans 8:11-19

¹¹ And if the Spirit of the one who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, the one who raised Christ from the dead will also make your mortal bodies alive through his Spirit, who is dwelling in you.

¹² So then, brothers, we do not owe it to the sinful flesh to live in harmony with it. ¹³ For if you live in harmony with the sinful flesh, you are going to die. But if by the Spirit you put to death the actions of the body, you will live.

¹⁴Indeed, those who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God. ¹⁵For you did not receive a spirit of slavery so that you are afraid again, but you received the Spirit of adoption by whom we call out, "*Abba*, Father!" ¹⁶The Spirit himself joins our spirit in testifying that we are God's children.

¹⁷ Now if we are children, we are also heirs—heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, since we suffer with him, so that we may also be glorified with him.

¹⁸ For I conclude that our sufferings at the present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is going to be revealed to us. ¹⁹ In fact, creation is waiting with eager longing for the sons of God to be revealed.
