INSTRUCTIONS FOR OUR ONLINE IN-HOME WORSHIP SERVICE

Thank you for joining us today in our online in-home worship service! This service is designed to be used with just one person or with your family and friends who have gathered to thank and praise Jesus for his continued goodness to us. Print as many copies of this bulletin as you wish or follow along looking at this file on any computer, tablet or phone.

Before watching, it may be helpful to remove distractions from the room such as pets, loud toys, etc. Parents might explain to children that we will be worshiping Jesus while the video is playing, listening and responding just like we usually do at church. It might feel a little odd at first to worship this way, but if you explain the situation beforehand, you can expect better participation in your home.

SEASON OF EASTER 2020

Our worship series during the season of Easter is called "Witness." We will follow the appointed lectionary readings from the book of Acts and see how the disciples carried out the instructions Jesus gave them to be his witnesses, through the power of the Holy Spirit. They were eyewitnesses of the resurrection. Not even the threat of death could stop them from faithfully witnessing to others. Our prayer is that through this worship series, we will be encouraged and empowered to witness to the people around us, starting right here where we live, and reaching out to the ends of the earth. We'll see



where our witnessing power comes from, get practical advice on how to share Christ, and get an idea of what to expect when we proclaim the wonderful Easter message of the risen Savior. God bless you as you witness!

TODAY'S FOCUS

Last Sunday we saw Jesus himself appear resurrected to the two Marys. This week we look to two more resurrection appearances, and we hear twice from Peter, one of the eyewitnesses of those appearances. In the 1 Peter lesson today, Peter reminds us that just because we are not eyewitnesses does not mean we have no joy or cannot witness to others. In today's sermon, we will be brought to the miraculous Pentecost sermon of Peter as we continue to be moved by the power of the resurrection and the joy of sharing it with others.

PRAYER BEFORE WORSHIP



INVOCATION

CONFESSION OF SINS

- M: To you, O Lord Father, Son + and Holy Spirit I lift up my soul; in you I trust, O my God.
- C: For the sake of your name, O Lord, forgive my iniquity, though it is great. Turn to me and be gracious to me. Look upon my affliction and my distress and take away all my sins. Remember not the sins of my youth, and my rebellious ways; according to your love remember me, for you are good, O Lord. Remember your great mercy and love, O Lord, for they are from of old.

ABSOLUTION

- M: All the ways of the Lord are loving and faithful. Good and upright is the Lord, and he instructs sinners in his ways. No one whose hope is in him will ever be put to shame. Therefore, in response to your confession, I assure you of God's mercy, and proclaim God's grace to you. Be of good cheer, for your sins are forgiven through Jesus Christ + our Lord and Savior.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

M: Let us pray.

O risen Savior, we are grateful that you appeared to so many people after your resurrection, not only to prove that you have truly risen from the dead, but to comfort your followers and prepare them to be witnesses of your salvation. Come and comfort us today through the Gospel so that we also may be faithful witnesses of your love to all those around us.

C: We praise you, together with the Father and the Holy Spirit, our God and Lord, forever and ever. Amen.

THE WORD

FIRST LESSON

The resurrection of Christ gives us new birth into a living hope. Although Jesus is not visible to our physical eyesight, faith fills us with joy and confidence in him, nonetheless. Our faith is precious, for by it, God continues to lead us through this life, even through trials and suffering, to our heavenly goal.

³Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! By his great mercy he gave us a new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, ⁴ into an inheritance that is undying, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you. ⁵Through faith you are being protected by God's power for the salvation that is ready to be revealed at the end of time.

⁶Because of this you rejoice very much, even though now for a little while, if necessary, you have been grieved by various kinds of trials ⁷so that the proven character of your faith—which is more valuable than gold, which passes away even though it is tested by fire—may be found to result in praise, glory, and honor when Jesus Christ is revealed.

⁸Though you have not seen him, you love him. Though you do not see him now, yet by believing in him, you are filled with a joy that is inexpressible and filled with glory, ⁹because you are receiving the goal of your faith, the salvation of your souls.



1 Peter 1:3-9

John 20:19-31

Thomas was blessed. He could see Jesus' hands, feet, and side. He could reach out and touch them. We are just as blessed for we can see and touch in faith. As our Lord says, "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."

¹⁹On the evening of that first day of the week, the disciples were together behind locked doors because of their fear of the Jews. Jesus came, stood among them, and said to them, "Peace be with you!" ²⁰ After he said this, he showed them his hands and side. So the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord.

²¹ Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you! Just as the Father has sent me, I am also sending you." ²² After saying this, he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³ Whenever you forgive people's sins, they are forgiven. Whenever you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven."

²⁴But Thomas, one of the Twelve, the one called the Twin, was not with them when Jesus came. ²⁵So the other disciples kept telling him, "We have seen the Lord!"

But he said to them, "Unless I see the nail marks in his hands, and put my finger into the mark of the nails, and put my hand into his side, I will never believe."

²⁶ After eight days, his disciples were inside again, and Thomas was with them. Though the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them. "Peace be with you," he said. ²⁷ Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and look at my hands. Take your hand and put it into my side. Do not continue to doubt, but believe."

²⁸Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!"

²⁹ Jesus said to him, "Because you have seen me, you have believed. Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."


³⁰ Jesus, in the presence of his disciples, did many other miraculous signs that are not written in this book. ³¹ But these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.



¹⁴Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice, and spoke loudly and clearly to them: "Men of Judea, and all you residents of Jerusalem, understand this, and listen closely to my words.

²² "Men of Israel, hear these words! Jesus the Nazarene was a man recommended to you by God with miracles, wonders, and signs that God did through him among you, as you yourselves know. ²³ This man, who was handed over by God's set plan and foreknowledge, you killed by having lawless men nail him to a cross. ²⁴ He is the one God raised up by freeing him from the agony of death, because death was not able to hold him in its grip.

²⁵ "Indeed, David says concerning him:

I saw the Lord always before me. Because he is at my right hand, I will not be shaken. ²⁶ Therefore my heart was glad, and my tongue rejoiced. My flesh also will rest in hope, ²⁷ because you will not abandon my life to the grave, nor will you let your Holy One see decay. ²⁸ You have made known to me the paths of life. You will fill me with joy in your presence.

²⁹ "Gentlemen, brothers, I can speak confidently to you about the patriarch David, that he both died and was buried, and his tomb is with us to this day. ³⁰ Since he was a prophet and knew that God had sworn to him with an oath that he would seat one of his descendants on his throne, ³¹ he saw what was coming and spoke about the resurrection of Christ, saying that he was neither abandoned to the grave nor did his flesh see decay.

³² "This Jesus is the one God has raised up. We are all witnesses of that."

- M: Guide our nation's leaders in dealing with our national and international problems. Help them to make decisions that will preserve peace and human dignity, as well as protect the precious freedoms which we enjoy.
- C: Bless all of us with gratitude for your blessings, peace in our forgiveness, and contentment in the work which you have given us.
- M: In your compassion, and in accord with your perfect timing, heal the bodies of those who are recovering from surgery. Comfort all who grieve the loss of a loved one through the forgiveness of sins and the hope of a resurrection to eternal life.

Lord, teach us to pray, even as you taught your first disciples to pray:

C: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and forever. Amen.
